 grasping the complexity of psychic human experiences
 ...and of contradictions, ambiguities
 providing representations of mind functioning
 encouraging multidisciplinary educational and cultural interventions (life skills: communication and interpersonal skills, narrative competence, affiliation, respect for differences, otheroriented attention)

- Making connections: multidisciplinary approaches – cognitive, psychological, biomedical sciences & cultural, gender, law, literary, philosophical, and sociological studies.
- Encompassing physical, mental, and sociocultural determinants
 - *Reflecting* on the role of psychology and of the arts and humanities to promote wellbeing and to build inclusive communities
 - Challenging the dominant narratives of the 'ideal' mind- and body-type

Teaching and Learning Methods and Activities

- Lecturers from different disciplines (bio-medical, cultural, gender, law, literary, philosophical, psychological, and sociological studies) & YOU
- Narrative Medicine Workshop: Group activities and discussion sessions, based on the signature practices of Narrative Medicine (*i.e.*, close reading, attentive listening, self-reflection, writing to a prompt, storytelling and sharing).

• Outdoor activities: All-day excursion to Arte Sella: The contemporary mountain; half-day guided tour of Rovereto; half-day excursion at the lake; and meditative-aesthetic workshop at the Modern and Contemporary Art Museum of Rovereto (MART).
