



**Announcement of selection for Doctoral positions
Doctoral School in

THE RECTOR

Given Law no. 210 of 3.07.1998 and in particular, art. 4, which assigns the organization of doctoral studies to universities in accordance with the general criteria stipulated by ministerial regulations;

Given the Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30.04.1999, regarding the general criteria to be followed by individual universities in the organization of doctoral studies;

Given the Decree by the Prime Minister of 9.04.2001, and subsequent amendments on the general criteria for uniform treatment regarding the right to higher education;

Given the Statute of the University of Trento and in particular art. 12, paragraph 9;

Given the University Regulations for Doctoral Schools, issued with the Rector's Decree no. 997 of 16.12.2003 and subsequently modified with Rector's Decree no. 359 of 19.04.2006;

Given the proposals made by the Department of Literary, Linguistics and Philology Studies;

Given the report of the internal Evaluation Committee of 16.01.2007 on the requirements for the Doctoral Schools proposed;

Given the resolution made jointly by the Academic Senate and the Scientific Research Committee on the 04.03.2009.

DECREES

ART. 1 – INSTITUTION

The University of Trento announces the 25th cycle of the Doctoral Programme in "Literary, Linguistics and Philology Studies" in co-operation with the University of Cagliari (Italy), the University of Charles de Gaulle - Lille 3 (France) and the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales/EHESS (France).

Length: three years

Specialized curricula:

- Classic Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures
- European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance
- Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies

Official language: Italian. However, some courses may be taught in languages other than Italian. Exclusively concerning the specialized curriculum in Classical Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures, both Italian and French are official languages of the school.

The competition for 8 doctoral positions in the Literary, Linguistics and Philology Studies Programme is hereby announced, 4 positions will be assigned grants financed by the University of Trento.

The number of grant-assisted places may be increased by funds from universities, public research bodies or qualified private organizations made available after the publication of this announcement and before the beginning of the selection. Any increase in the number of available places resulting from an increase of grants will be communicated through the official notice board of the University of Trento and posted on the website: <http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd/llps.htm>

ART. 2 –ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applications for the doctoral positions above are accepted from candidates, regardless of sex, age and citizenship, who have an Italian "*laurea specialistica*" (magistrale), according to the Ministerial Decree no. 509 of 3.11.1999 as amended; a university degree granted under the Italian regulations previously in force, or equivalent degree qualification obtained abroad.

Applicants who have a foreign qualification not officially recognized as equivalent to the Italian "laurea", must explicitly request recognition of equivalence in their application.

In this case, the following documents must be attached to the application:

- (1) the degree certificate or self-certification (according to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000 concerning EU citizens);
- (2) the English translation of the degree certificate with exams taken and grades obtained, duly signed, to enable the Doctoral School Committee to declare its equivalence, valid solely for the purpose of admission to the selection process.

Successful non-EU applicants holding a non-Italian qualification and successful EU applicants holding a non-EU qualification, must present their degree certificate with the examinations passed and the scores obtained, translated and authenticated by an Italian consulate, embassy or diplomatic representative in the country of the university that issued the degree and the respective declaration of equivalent value ("*Dichiarazione di valore*") not later than the date set for enrolment in the Doctoral School .

Applications are also invited from students who expect to complete their degree **by the 15th of October 2009**. In such cases admission will be "conditional" and the applicant must be able to present the relevant degree certificate, or a declaration that the degree has been conferred (applicable only to citizens of the European Union in compliance with Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000) to the Secretariat of the Doctoral School in Literary, Linguistics and Philology Studies (fax 0461 881751) within the same date.

Art. 3 – THE PROGRAM

The Doctoral programme will be constituted by seminars for each specialized curriculum:

First year

a) Classic Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures.

Seminars dealing with the following topics:

Philology and Textual criticism, Palaeography, Lexicography, Historical linguistics, Stylistics and Metrics, History of classical rhetoric, History of ancient theatre, Greek literature, Latin literature, Ancient Christian literature.

Furthermore, the doctoral students will attend some seminars about the methodology of research in the fields of classical philology and classical literatures.



b) European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance

Seminars dealing with the following topics:

Hagiography, Historical anthropology, Philology and Textual criticism, Lexicography and Lexicology, Christian literature, Historical linguistics, Rhetoric, Semiotics, Stylistics and Metrics, History of the book, History of the theatre, Theory of literary genres, Theory of reception, Translation studies.

During the first year the doctoral students are required to learn a foreign language other than the one presented at the admission examination.

c) Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies

Seminars dealing with the following topics:

Discourse analysis, Text analysis, Literary hermeneutics, Philology of literary texts, Rhetoric, Semiotics, Sociolinguistics, Stylistics and Metrics, History of literary criticism, Intercultural studies, History of comparative literature, Theory of literary genres, Theory of literary criticism, Aesthetics, Theory of reception, Translation studies, Theory of comparative literature, Postcolonial studies, Gender studies.

During the first year the doctoral students are required to learn a foreign language other than the one presented at the admission examination.

At the end of the first year of the course doctoral students who have successfully completed all the seminars will be admitted to the final examination, held before a Commission for each curriculum named by the Doctoral School Committee. The Commission evaluates the doctoral student's effective scientific growth, that his/her chosen area of specialization is coherent with curriculum and aptitude, and to what extent he/she has mastered his/her second foreign language. The knowledge of a foreign language other than the one chosen for the admission examination will be verified as concerns the doctoral students of the European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance, and of the Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies.

An overall positive evaluation gives admission to the second year of the course.

Second year

a) Classic Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures.

Seminars dealing with the following topics:

Methodology of research in the fields of classical philology and classical literatures, Philology and Textual criticism, Palaeography, Lexicography, Historical linguistics, History of classical rhetoric, History of ancient theatre, Greek literature, Latin literature, Ancient Christian literature.

Furthermore, the doctoral students will attend some seminars about the methodology of research in the fields of classical philology and classical literatures.

b) European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance

Seminars dealing with the following topics:

Hermeneutics of Medieval and of Protomodern texts, Forms of narrativity, Literature and Philosophy, Literature and Religion, Literature and Historiography, Literature, music and the visual arts, Traditions of lyric poetry.

c) Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies

Seminars dealing with the following topics:

Forms of narrativity, Literature and Philosophy, Literature and Religion, Literature, music and the visual arts, Modernism and Post-modernism, Cultural studies, Gender studies, Post-colonial studies, Theory of communication, Drama theories and forms, Inter-semiotic translation, Traditions of lyric poetry.

At the end of the second year of the course doctoral students who have successfully completed all the seminars related to the specific specialized curriculum will be admitted to the final examination, held before a Commission for each curriculum named by the Doctoral School Committee. The Commission evaluates the doctoral student's skill to carry out the research project. The candidate is required to discuss his/her research project.

An overall positive evaluation gives admission to the third year of the course.

During the second year the doctoral students of the European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance and Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies curricula, participating in a co-tutelle programme, will be required to spend a period of study in the foreign University according to the provisions of the Agreement.

In case the doctoral students should not take part in a co-tutelle programme they are strongly invited



to spend a period abroad after carrying out their duties concerning the didactics.

Third year

During the third year the doctoral students will write their final dissertation. Specific seminars useful for the elaboration of their final dissertation will be organised.

As concerns the curricula in European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance and Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies specific seminars, conferences and meetings dealing with the subject of the research areas will take place.

As concerns the curriculum in Classic Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures seminars on the Methodology of Research in the field of classic studies will be held.

The doctoral students of the Classic Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures should spend a period of research and study abroad according to the cooperation agreement subscribed with the foreign partners.

Art. 4 – APPLICATION

Applications may only be made using the application form attached to this announcement.

The application, including all the annexes required, must arrive at the University of Trento **within the 22nd of September 2009**, in one of the following ways:

The University of Trento shall not be held responsible for misaddressed applications, changes in the candidate's address, postal or telegraphic errors not caused by the administration.

Applications arriving after the 22nd of September 2009 will be disregarded, even if sent before this date.

According to Italian Law no. 104/92, art. 20, and to Italian Law no. 68/99, art. 16, paragraph 1, disabled applicants are expected to indicate explicitly in their application whether they require special assistance or extra time during the examinations. Under Legislative Decree 196/03, all information will be kept confidential.

Applications should include:

- photocopy of the applicant's identity card or passport;
- degree certificate or degree self-certification (according to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000 concerning EU citizens), with a list of the examinations passed successfully and scores obtained in each examination (except for candidates who have not yet obtained their degree certificate at the time of presentation of the application as outlined in Art. 2 of this announcement). Applicants holding a foreign qualification that has not been officially recognized as equivalent to the Italian degree, are required to attach a translation in English of the degree certificate with exams and scores obtained, signed under their own responsibility, in order to allow the Doctoral School Committee to declare its equivalence, valid for the only purpose of participating in the selection;
- curriculum studiorum;
- a short research project in one of the research areas of the School. In case the candidate should be admitted the research project should be approved by the Doctoral School Committee.
- any certificates proving the knowledge of English and other languages;
- any other qualification believed useful in the assessment of the applicant (dissertations, scientific publications, study and post-graduate activities of research, prizes, grants, etc.).

If, pursuant to submission of their application, applicants have to add further information, it must reach the University offices **by the 22nd of September 2009** in one of the ways listed in the letters a) or b) of this article. The applicant's name, Doctoral School in Literary, Linguistics and Philology Studies and the subject ("*Integrazione domanda*") must be clearly written on the envelope.



The University of Trento reserves the right to verify (including spot checking), declarations and documents submitted by candidates, according to art. 71 and subsequent articles of the Presidential Decree no. 445 dated 28.12.2000.

At any time, candidates failing to meet the requisites specified, may be omitted from the selection process for the Doctoral School .

Art. 5 – SELECTION

The selection aims to assess the candidate's knowledge and aptitude for scientific research in the area of the **specialized curriculum** chosen by the candidate.

Selection procedures will be held in Italian as concerns the curriculum in European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance and the curriculum in Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies. As concerns the curriculum in Classic Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures in Italian or in French.

The selection consists in:

- assessment of qualifications according to art. 4;
- a written exam on a topic, involving one of the basic disciplines selected from the scientific areas of each curriculum;
- an oral exam, which will also evaluate the candidate's knowledge of a chosen language among English, German, French, Spanish, Russian, Swedish and Dutch.

Applicants must show a valid identification document in order to be admitted to the examination.

The Admissions Committee can assign each candidate a total score of 120 divided as follows:

- 10 points for qualifications;
- 50 points for the written examination;
- 60 points for the oral examination.

Only applicants obtaining a minimum score of 42/60 points in the assessment of qualifications together with the written examination will be admitted to the oral exam.

The oral exam is successfully passed with a minimum score of 36/60 points.

At least 20 days before the date of the examination, time and location of it will be displayed on the website: <http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd/lips.htm> as laid down in Art. 20 of the University Regulations for Doctoral School.

Art. 6 – PROGRAMME OF THE EXAMINATION

The **written examination** will consist in a composition on a topic related to one of the specialised curricula: Candidates choosing the "Classic Philology, Greek and Latin Literatures" curriculum will be given the choice between the translation and the comment on a Latin or Greek text;

Candidates choosing the "European Literatures of the Middle Ages and of the Renaissance" and the "Comparative Literature and Cultural Studies" curricula will write a composition on a topic concerning methodological and cultural issues related to the specific curriculum.

The **oral examination** will generally assess the candidate's knowledge of the topics of the selected curriculum and will also assess the subject of the research that the candidate intends to conduct.

During the oral examination the knowledge of at least one foreign language among English, French, Spanish, German, Russian, Swedish, Dutch will be tested (to participate in the selection, the linguistic knowledge that will be verified has to be clearly pointed out in the application form).

Admission to the School, considering the number of doctoral positions, is based on the general merit-based ranking draw up by the Examination Committee.

Art. 7 – ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE

The Rector, after hearing the Doctoral School Committee, appoints the Admissions Committee. It will consist of 3 members chosen among Italian and foreign tenured professors and researchers, who are experts in the research areas of the Doctoral School. The Committee may also include no more than two Italian or foreign experts from public and private national and international research institutes.

When the entrance examinations are over, the Committee will draw up a general merit-based ranking according to the grades obtained by the applicants in each examination.



The final ranking of candidates will be posted on the website:

With this posting, notification concerning the proceedings is considered to be fulfilled.

Successful applicants will not receive personal communication of the results.

Art. 8 - ADMISSION TO THE DOCTORAL SCHOOL

Short-listed applicants will be admitted to the Doctoral School according to their order on the list until all available places have been filled.

If candidates are equally worthy of admission, the student's economic situation will be evaluated for places that include a grant, in accordance with the Prime Minister's Decree (D.P.C.M.) of 9.04.2001 as amended; for places not subject to a grant, the younger student shall be given priority.

If a successful applicant withdraws before the beginning of the Programme, the next applicant on the list will be offered the place.

If a successful applicant withdraws or is excluded in the first three-month term of the first year of the Programme, the Doctoral School Committee may decide to fill the vacant place with another candidate according to his/her order on the merit-based ranking.

According to art. 19(3) of the University Regulations for Doctoral School and according to previous Doctoral School Committee resolutions, the Admissions Committee may admit up to 20% of the total assigned places candidates who are eligible in the general ranking, if they belong to the following categories:

- applicants from non-EU countries who have been awarded any kind of grant;
- applicants from a country with a specific intergovernmental agreement with Italy, on the basis of a bilateral agreement between the University of Trento and the foreign university (with no obligatory financial burden for the University of Trento);
- short-listed applicants who have been awarded grants under Law 449/97, art. 51 ("*Assegni di ricerca*").

Art. 9 – HOW TO ENROL

Successful applicants should forward their application for enrolment on paper with attached tax stamps to the following address:

In particular cases provided for under Italian law, the receipt of payment of the provincial tax for the right to university study ("*Tassa provinciale per il diritto allo studio universitario*"- TDS) must be attached to applications.

In their applications (application forms are available at the University of Trento - *Ufficio Dottorati ed Esami di Stato* and on the website: <http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd.htm>) candidates should declare:

- ask / not ask to be awarded a grant (including successful applicants who are not eligible for a grant in case an applicant eligible for a grant gives up his/her place);
- declare that they already receive / do not receive a grant by the Governo Italiano thanks to projects of international cooperation and development assistance or to intergovernmental agreements on cultural and scientific cooperation;
- declare that they have / have not already been awarded (even for a single year only) a grant for an Italian Doctoral School ;
- declare that they are not already enrolled and undertake not to enrol on any other programme for a diploma, degree, an Italian "*Scuola di Specializzazione*" (Specialisation programme), Doctoral School s or master's programme, whether of the I or the II level, for the duration of this Doctoral School ; in the event that they are, they will cease attending such a school before the start of the Doctoral School ;
- declare that they are / are not employed by the Italian public sector;
- declare that they will request authorization for employment from the Doctoral School Committee in advance;
- undertake to inform the University immediately of any changes to their residential details or address.

Successful non-EU applicants holding a non-Italian qualification and successful EU applicants holding a non-EU qualification must present their degree certificate with the examinations passed and the scores obtained, translated and authenticated by an Italian consulate, embassy or diplomatic representative in the country of



the university that issued the degree and the respective declaration of equivalent value (“Dichiarazione di valore”) within the date of enrolment.

Successful applicants who do not send their application **within 15 days** following the date of publication of the list on the website: <http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd/lips.htm> lose the right to enrol and the corresponding place will be offered to the next candidate(s) on the list.

Art. 10 – GRANTS

Grants are assigned on the basis of the merit-based ranking of applicants drawn up by the Admissions Committee.

If a candidate awarded a grant forfeits this right, the next candidate on the list will be offered the grant.

In the case of one or more grants financed by external entities, the candidates can choose which grant to benefit from, based on their position in the ranking.

The gross amount of the scholarship is Euro 13,638.47 per year¹.

Grants are normally paid bi-monthly in advance, with recovery of undue payments if the student is expelled or suspended.

Grants cannot be combined with other grants, except those awarded by national or foreign scientific institutes for periods spent abroad and deemed useful for the research activities of the student.

The grant is increased by 50% for any periods spent abroad that are authorized by the Head of the School or by the Doctoral School Committee.

The study grant is awarded for the entire duration of the Programme following confirmation by the Doctoral School Committee of the results achieved every year.

Failure to attend the Programme for over thirty days will lead to the grant being suspended.

Art. 11 - DOCTORAL STUDENTS RIGHTS AND DUTIES

Doctoral students must undertake to attend the Doctoral School and to carry out research activities on a full time basis according to the schedules and the regulations laid down by the Doctoral School Committee, as specified in Art. 3 of the present announcement.

Students writing a co-tutelle thesis are also obliged to carry out study and research activities in compliance with the agreement with the foreign university.

In case of negative opinion given by the Doctoral School Committee regarding activities and studies, the Rector can exclude students from the Doctoral School.

Grants financed by external bodies where specific research is required limit the grant holder to carry out this work for the entire Programme.

For the duration of the Doctoral Programme, students are insured by the University against accidents and damage to third parties that occur in circumstances pertaining to the Doctoral School.

From the beginning and for the whole duration of the Doctoral Programme, a public service employee participating in a Doctoral School may request leave of absence for reasons of study, without monetary allowances, and may benefit from the study grant, where the required conditions are met.

In the case of admission to a Doctoral School without a study grant, or should he/she waive it, the person on leave of absence enjoys the economic remuneration and social insurance and retirement benefits by the public administration where he/she is employed. Should the employee terminate employment in public administration within the two years succeeding his / her having obtained a Doctorate, the amounts paid out during the course of the Doctoral studies will be reclaimed.

Art. 12 – DOCTORAL TITLE CONFERRAL

The doctoral title, conferred by the Rector, is granted when students pass the final examination which takes place at the end of the doctorate programme.

The Examination Committee will be nominated by the Rector, upon the advice of the Doctoral School Committee according to the University Regulations for Doctoral School.

The candidate will discuss the thesis in the language agreed with the Head of the School.

¹ At the moment of the publication of this announcement the current Italia Law states that the doctoral scholarship is subject to social security contributions (INPS 17% or 25,72%. One third of the tax is chargeable to the doctoral student) according to art 2(26) of Law no. 335/95 as amended.



The candidate can be allowed to discuss the final dissertation in one of the Universities cooperating with the Doctoral School by the Doctoral School Committee.

On the basis of a specific Agreement the Doctoral student having spent a research period of at least one academic year in one of the foreign Universities, under the supervision of a tutor belonging to the foreign University, could grant the title, equivalent to the Italian one "Dottore di Ricerca", issued by the foreign University involved.

Release of title certification is dependent upon delivery of the final thesis to the University's open access institutional archive on behalf of the graduate, that guarantees the conservation and public availability of the thesis. It is the University's responsibility to then deposit the thesis, according to law, among the National Libraries of Rome and Florence.

Art. 13 – PERSONAL DATA

The University of Trento, in accordance with Legislative Decree 196/03 "Italian Personal Data Protection Code", uses the applicants' personal data only for fulfilment of the selection procedures and for institutional reasons.

In observance of the above-mentioned law, participation in the selection requires the applicant to give the University of Trento permission to publish his/her personal data concerning the results of the selection procedure on the University website.

Art. 14 – FURTHER REGULATIONS

For matters not explicitly mentioned in the present announcement, art. 4 of Law no. 210 of 03.07.1998, the Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30.04.1999 and the University Regulations for Doctoral School issued with the Rector's Decree no. 997 of 16.12. 2003 and amended with the Rector's Decree no.359 of 19.04.2006.
