



**Announcement of selection for Doctoral positions

Given the report of the internal Evaluation Committee of 15th of January 2008 on the requirements for the Doctoral Programmes proposed;

DECREES

ART. 1 - INSTITUTION

The University of Trento announces the 24th cycle of the Doctoral Programme in "Mathematics" in collaboration with "Centro di Ricerca di Matematica E. De Giorgi" of the Scuola Normale Superiore di Pisa (Italy).

Length: three years

Selection for 8 doctoral positions in the Mathematics Programme is announced, 5 positions will be assigned grants financed by the University of Trento.

The number of grant-assisted places may be increased by funds from universities, public research bodies or qualified private organizations made available after the publication of this announcement and before the



beginning of the selection. Any increase in the number of available places resulting from an increase of grants will be communicated through the official notice board of the University of Trento and posted on the website: <http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd/ma.htm>

ART. 2 –ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applications for the doctoral positions are accepted from candidates, regardless of gender, age and nationality, who have an Italian “laurea magistrale” in compliance with Ministerial Decree no. 509 of 3.11.1999 as amended, a university degree of the previously enforced Italian regulations, or an equivalent academic degree obtained abroad.

Applicants who have a foreign degree which has not been officially recognized as equivalent to an Italian degree must submit a request for equivalence in the application. This is done by adding the following documents:

- degree certificate (according to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000 regarding self-certifications for EU citizens)
- translation into English of the degree certificate, with exams taken, grades obtained and signed by the applicant to enable the Doctorate School Committee to declare its equivalence, for the sole purpose of being admitted to the selection of this call.

After admission to the School, successful non-EU applicants who have a foreign qualification and successful EU applicants who have a foreign degree, must provide the degree certificate with exams and grades obtained, translated and certified by the Italian Embassy or Consulate in the country of the university that issued the degree, and the value declaration (“Dichiarazione di Valore”) **within the enrolment date.**

Applications are also accepted from students who expect to complete their degree **by the 15.10.2008**. In such cases admission is "conditional" and applicants must be able to present the degree certificate or a declaration that the degree has been conferred (according to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000 applicable only to EU citizens) **by this date.**

Art. 3 – THE DOCTORAL PROGRAM

The Doctoral Program in Mathematics lasts three years and it is articulated into four curricula:

a) General Curriculum

This curriculum deals with on one or more of the following scientific research areas:

- Calculus of Variations
- Nonlinear Partial Differential Equations
- Analytic and Algebraic Geometry
- Mathematical Physics and Dynamical Systems
- Stochastic Processes
- Mathematical Logic
- Lie Groups and Lie Algebra Theory
-

b) Curriculum in "Mathematical Modeling and Scientific Computing (MAMOSC)"

This curriculum will transversely deal with the following scientific research areas:

- Biomathematics and Population Dynamics
- Stochastic Processes
- Numerical Methods for Partial Differential Equations.

And some significant key words are:

- Mathematical Modeling
- Numerical Analysis
- High- Performance Computing
- Scientific Data Visualization
- Applications to Physics, Biology, Chemistry and Engineering

c) Curriculum “Mathematics Education and Communication”

This curriculum will transversely deal with the following scientific research areas:



- Mathematical Education: mathematical learning and cognitive processes; school curricula, reference systems and standards; tests' methodology and evaluation techniques of the mathematical knowledge.
- Mathematics' Communication: programs and strategies; planning, implementation, experimentation, and evaluation of materials and of techniques for Mathematics' Communication.

d) Curriculum "Algebraic Coding Theory and Cryptography: algebraic and geometric methods"

This curriculum aims at fostering research in the mathematical methods underpinning algebraic coding theory and cryptography, in particular:

Algebraic methods: linear algebra, commutative algebra, computational algebra, Groebner bases, numerical fields, group theory;

Geometric methods: algebraic geometry over finite fields, elliptic curves.

The research problems range from purely theoretical classifications to industrial applications, the latter complemented by internships within leading companies.

The Doctoral Program is divided among the three years in the following way.

1st year

The 1st year is a guidance year through the scientific offerings of the Department of Mathematics, but also the beginning of the research activity. Each Doctoral student is assigned a tutor who has to be member of the Doctoral School Committee. The Doctoral student must submit to the Head of the School a written study plan, approved by the tutor, by the end of January of the current academic year.

According to this plan each student will follow three courses to be chosen, for curricula a), b) and d), among the ones held by the Doctoral School of the University of Trento, in general in the period February 1st – April 30, for curriculum c) either among the ones held by the Doctoral School of the University of Trento or else among the ones held by the Faculties of the University of Trento or elsewhere (Summer Schools, European Schools, Workshops).

The Doctoral School Committee can also ask the Doctoral student to include in the study plan the attendance of particular courses because of their scientific importance for his/her education.

Each course in the study plan is requested to have a lecturer, responsible for the evaluation procedure of the final examination.

The final examination for the Doctoral student in one of these three courses has to include a written test proposed and read by the lecturer responsible for the course, and an oral discussion. The final examination for the second and third courses is an oral exam. In alternative, for the third course the final examination can be a talk given by the Doctoral student on a topic proposed by the lecturer responsible for the course. In general, the exams have to be finished before June 30 of the first year.

Students are invited to attend basic and advanced specific seminar organised either from the research groups of the Department of Mathematics and/or the Doctoral School, as well as workshops and summer schools.

Before April 30 of the first year the Doctoral student will have to choose an advisor with whom he/she will decide the topic of his/her thesis. Thesis' topic will have to be concerned with one of the research areas involved in the above curricula.

The advisor typically is a member of the Doctoral School Committee. Upon a motivate request of the Doctoral student the Doctoral School Committee can allow the choice of an external advisor. In this case the Doctoral School Committee have also to single out one of its member who formally acts as internal advisor during thesis period.

By the end of October of the current academic year the Doctoral student must give to the Head of the School a written report on his/her first-year activity and to submit a project about his/her thesis. Moreover he/she will have to pass a final oral examination for the admission to the second year of the Doctoral School, in front of a committee formed by the three courses' lecturers, the advisor and the Head of the School or a delegate of him/her. The committee will have to evaluate the Doctoral student's activity and to write a report, signed by the committee's members, with a recommendation about the admission of the student to the second year. The Doctoral student will be directly admitted to the second year following a positive committee evaluation, after this information is provided to the Doctoral School Committee by the Head of the School. In case of negative recommendation the Doctoral School Committee could exclude the Doctoral student from the Doctoral School or propose his/her conditional admission to the second year. Indeed the student could be required to attend a more suitable study program agreed by the Doctoral School Committee and he/she will have to pass a final examination by the end of February of the second year.

The evaluation committee report will have to be kept, together with the study program and written tests, in the



official record of Doctoral School for the student at the Secretary of the Department of Mathematics.

2nd and 3rd year

The 2nd and the 3rd year are devoted to the research for the thesis.

The Doctoral student fully takes the typical life of a mathematics researcher and will participate regularly to international scientific events regarding his/her chosen area, as well as in those related that are deemed useful in his/her formation.

By the end of the second year the Doctoral student is required to write an account on his/her scientific activity. Such an account is evaluated by a committee formed by his/her advisor and two members of the Doctoral School Committee. The committee will have to evaluate the Doctoral student's activity and to write a report, signed by the committee's members, with a recommendation about the admission of the student to the third year. The Doctoral student will be directly admitted to the third year following a positive committee evaluation, after this information is provided to the Doctoral School Committee by the Head of the School. In case of negative recommendation the Doctoral School Committee could exclude the Doctoral student from the Doctoral School or admit him/her under condition.

By the end of the third year the Doctoral student is required to write an account on his/her scientific activity, which, together with the report of the advisor on the thesis, will be used by the Doctoral School Committee for deciding about the admission of the student to the final examination.

The Doctoral student is strongly encouraged to spend abroad some period of their activity in those universities involved in his/her research areas.

Art. 4 – APPLICATION

Applications should be made using the application form attached to this announcement.

The application, including all the annexes required, must arrive at the University of Trento **by the 29th of September 2008** in one of the following ways:

The University of Trento is not responsible for mistakes made by post offices or for mistakes in the addresses indication made by the candidate.

The applicant should ensure that the address given for correspondence and the telephone number are correct and that any changes are reported as soon as possible to Ufficio Dottorati di Ricerca.

Applications arriving after the 29th of September 2008 will not be considered, even if sent before this date.

According to Italian Law no. 104/92, Art. 20 and Italian Law no. 68/99, Art. 16, para. 1, applicants with special needs are expected to indicate explicitly in their application whether they require special assistance or extra time during the examinations. Under Legislative Decree 196/03, all information will be kept confidential.

Applications should include:

- photocopy of the applicant's identity card or passport;
- degree certificate or degree self-certification (according to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000 concerning EU citizens) with a list of the examinations passed successfully and the scores obtained in each examination.
Applicants expecting to complete their degree by the 15th of October 2008, to be admitted in the selection, must submit a certification or self-certification (according to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000 concerning EU citizens) of the enrolment in the course of studies with a list of the examinations passed successfully and scores obtained in each examination. The applicants must then be able to present the degree certificate, or a declaration that the degree has been conferred (according to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000, applicable only to citizens of the European Union), by this date.
Applicants with a foreign qualification that has not been officially recognized as equivalent to the Italian degree have to attach an English translation of the degree certificate with exams and scores obtained,



- signed under their own responsibility, in order to allow the Doctoral School Committee to evaluate the equivalence, valid for the only purpose of participating in the selection.;
- a hard copy of the degree dissertation. Students, who expect to complete their degree within the 15th of October 2008, are required to send it within this date;
 - summary of the dissertation explaining the reasons for the choice of the subject, the research methodology, results obtained and discussion/evaluation;
 - two letters of recommendation written by the dissertation advisor and/or other experts on the doctoral research subject. The letters must be in a sealed envelope;
 - any other qualifications believed useful in the assessment of the applicant.

If, afterwards the submission of their application, candidates have to add further information, it must reach the University offices by the 29th of September 2008. The applicant's name, the Doctoral Programme the applicant is applying for and the object "Integrazione domanda" must be clearly written on the envelope.

The University of Trento has the right to check, even to spot, declarations and documents provided by the candidates, according to art. 71 and following articles of the Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000. Candidates not fulfilling the requirements requested can be omitted from the selection for the doctoral programme at any time.

Art. 5 – SELECTION

The selection for the doctoral School aims to evaluate the candidates' aptitude to the scientific research.

The examination consists in the assessment of titles listed in the art.4.

The candidates obtaining a total score of at least 50/90 points will be short-listed.

Art. 6 – ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE

The Rector, after hearing the Doctoral School Committee, appoints the Admissions Committee. It will consist of three members chosen among Italian and foreign professors and researchers, who are experts in the scientific areas of the Doctoral School. The Committee may also include two experts belonging to public and private national and international research institutes.

After the titles' evaluation the final ranking of candidates will be posted on the website:
<http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd/ma.htm> and it will be put up on the notice Board of the exam's place.

Through publication of the list, notification concerning the proceedings is considered to be fulfilled.

The successful applicants will not receive personal communication of their results.

Art. 7 - ADMISSION TO THE DOCTORAL SCHOOL

Short-listed applicants will be admitted to the Doctoral School according to the order on the list till the available places have been filled.

If the candidates are equally worthy of admission, the student's economic situation will be evaluated for places that include a grant, in accordance with the Decree of the President of the Council of Ministers (D.P.C.M.) of 9.04.2001 as amended, for places without grant, the youngest student will be given the place.

If a successful applicant withdraws before the beginning of the programme, the next applicant on the list will be offered the place.

If a successful applicant withdraws or is excluded in the first three-month term of the first year, the Doctoral School Committee may decide to fill the vacant place with another candidate on the list.

According to Art. 19, paragraph 3 of the University Regulations for Doctoral Schools and according to previous Doctoral School Committee resolutions, the Admissions Committee may admit to the School up to 25% of the total assigned places, candidates who are eligible in the general ranking, if they belong to the following categories:

- applicants from non-EU countries who have been awarded any kind of grant;
- applicants from a country with whom exists a specific intergovernmental agreement with Italy, followed by a specific agreement with the University of Trento (with no obligatory financial burden for the University of Trento);
- short-listed applicants who have been awarded grants under Law 449/97, Art. 51 ("Assegni di ricerca").



Art. 8 – HOW TO ENROL

Successful applicants should forward their application for enrolment on paper with attached stamp duty to:
“University of Trento – Direzione Didattica e Servizi agli Studenti – Ufficio Dottorati ed Esami di Stato, Via Inama 5 – 38100 Trento (ITALY)” within 15 days after the date of the publication of the final ranking.

The receipt of payment of the provincial tax for the right to university study (TDS) must be attached to the applications if it has been foreseen.

In their applications (forms are available at Ufficio Dottorati di Ricerca and on the website: <http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd.htm>), candidates should:

- ask / ask not to be awarded a grant (including successful applicants who are not eligible for a grant in case an applicant eligible for a grant gives up his/her place);
- declare that they already receive / do not receive a grant by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs or by other Italian or foreign institution;
- declare that they have / have not already been awarded (even for one year only) a grant for an Italian Doctoral Programme;
- declare that they are not already enrolled and undertake not to enrol on any other programme for a diploma, degree, an Italian “Scuola di Specializzazione”, Doctoral or master degree (if it is a I or II level) for the duration of this Doctoral School. Or alternatively, declare that they will stop attending such a school before the start of the Doctoral School;
- declare that they are / are not employed by the Italian public administration;
- declare to request in advance the Doctoral School Committee authorization to carry out any kind of work activity;
- undertake to inform the University of any changes of their residence or address.

Non-EU applicants admitted to the Programme who have a foreign qualification and EU-applicants admitted to the Programme who have a university degree obtained in a non-EU country must attach their degree with exams taken and grades obtained, translated and authenticated by an Italian Consulate, Embassy or Diplomatic Representative in the country of the university that issued the degree and its declaration of validity (“Dichiarazione di Valore”) within the enrolment date.

Successful applicants who do not send their application within 15 days following the date of publication of the list on the website: <http://portale.unitn.it/en/ec/phd/ma.htm> lose the right to enrol and the corresponding places will be offered to the next candidates on the list.

Art. 9 – GRANTS

Grants are assigned on the basis of the merit-based ranking of applicants drawn up by the Admissions Committee, at candidate's request.

If a candidate forfeits his right, the next candidate on the list will be offered the grant.

In case grants financed by external bodies would be available successful applicants can choose one of these scholarships according to their position in the merit-based ranking.

In 2008¹ the amount of the annual scholarship after tax has been determined as follows:

- 9.876,33 EUR for doctoral students residing in Italy
- 10.561,54 EUR for doctoral students residing outside Italy who can adopt the agreement in order not to avoid getting taxed in both countries.
- 10.173,21 EUR for the doctoral students residing in Italy and contributing to an additional social security system.

Grants are normally paid bi-monthly in advance, with recoupment of undue payments in case the student is expelled or suspended.

Grants cannot be combined with other scholarships, except those awarded by national or foreign scientific institutes for periods spent abroad and deemed useful for the research activities of the Doctoral student.

Scholarships are increased by 50% for any periods spent abroad authorized by the Coordinator or by the Doctoral School Committee.

Grants are awarded for the whole duration of the Programme following confirmation by the Doctoral School Committee of the results achieved every year by the Doctoral students.

¹ At the moment of the publication of this announcement the current Italia Law states that the doctoral scholarship is subject to social security contributions (INPS 17% or 24,72%. One third of the tax is chargeable to the doctoral student) according to art 2(26) of Law no. 335/95 as amended.



The grant will be suspended in case the doctoral student should not attend the Programme for over thirty days.

Art. 10 - RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF DOCTORAL STUDENTS

Doctoral students are required to attend the doctoral programme and to carry out research activities on a full time basis according to the schedules and the regulations laid down by the Doctoral School Committee, as specified in Art. 3 of the present announcement.

Students writing an co-tutelle thesis have to carry out study and research activities on the basis of the agreement signed with the foreign University.

On the basis of an evaluation concerning the activities carried out by the doctoral student the Doctoral School Committee can propose the Rector to exclude student from the Doctoral School.

Grants financed by external bodies and concerning a specific research area limit the grant holders to carry out research in this area. for the entire Programme.

During the Doctoral Programme, students are insured by the University against accidents and damage to third parties occurring in circumstances pertaining the Programme.

A public service employee admitted to the Doctoral School may request leave of absence for reasons of study for the whole duration of the doctoral course, without allowances, and may benefit from the scholarship, if the required conditions are met.

In the case of admission to a doctoral course without a scholarship, or if the candidate has declined the scholarship, the person on leave of absence enjoys the economic remuneration and social insurance and retirement benefits enjoyed by the public administration where he/she is employed. Should the employee terminate employment in public administration in the two years succeeding his / her having obtained the doctoral title, the amounts paid during the course of the doctoral studies will be claimed back.

Art. 11– DOCTORAL TITLE CONFERRAL

The doctoral title, conferred by the Rector, is awarded when students pass the final examination at the end of the doctoral Programme.

The Examination Committee will be appointed by the Rector, upon the advice of the Doctoral School Committee and in accordance with the University Regulations for Doctoral Schools.

Release of title certification is dependent upon delivery of the final thesis to the University's open access institutional archive on behalf of the graduate, that guarantees the conservation and public availability of the thesis. It is the University's responsibility to then deposit the thesis, according to law, among the National Libraries of Rome and Florence.

Art. 12 – PERSONAL DATA

The University of Trento, in accordance with Legislative Decree 196/03 "Italian Personal Data Protection Code", uses the applicants' personal data only for fulfilment of the selection procedures and for institutional reasons.

In observance of the above-mentioned law, participation in the selection requires the applicant to give the University of Trento permission to publish his/her personal data concerning the results of the selection procedure on the University website.

Art. 13 – REFERRAL RULE

- summary of the dissertation explaining the reasons for the choice of the subject, the research methodology, results obtained and discussion/evaluation;
- two letters of recommendation written by the dissertation advisor and/or other experts on the doctoral research subject. The letters must be in a sealed envelope;
- any other qualifications believed useful in the assessment of the applicant.

⁶ After the conclusion of the entrance examination procedure, applicants intending to receive back their documents attached to their application for the selection of the Doctoral School must write to the Administration (Ufficio Dottorati di Ricerca) a specific request within a year the expire date of the present announcement. Any postal expenses will be met by the applicant.
