JOINT EUROPEAN MASTER IN COMPARATIVE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT - EMMC CoDe

The Corvinus University of Budapest (Hungary), coordinator, the University of Ljubljana (Slovenia), the University of Regensburg (Germany) and the University of Trento (Italy) with the support of the Erasmus Mundus Programme of the European Union, offer a Joint Master's course degree.

Associated partner universities of the Master CoDe programme are the <u>Russian State Social University</u> (Russia), the <u>University of Belgrade</u> (Serbia), the <u>University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill</u> (USA) and the <u>Tshwane University of Technology</u> (South Africa).

Duration: 2 years (120 ECTS).

Main objective of Master CoDe programme is to provide participants with the necessary knowledge and skills for introducing, supporting and co-ordinating processes of change and transformation at local level. The focus of the programme is local development, with the following characteristics: public, private and non-governmental actors are the fundamental agents; social stability and economic prosperity are pursued, in conformity with the European standards and best practices. The general approach is comparative and interdisciplinary. Official language: **English**.

- III. Internship for research (10 ECTS): internship is held in qualified organisations (institutions of local and regional government, public/private partnerships, decentralised administrations of national government, industrial districts, trans-border co-operation-projects, policies for enterprises and local development, services to enterprises, research centres, local banks, NGOs active at local level or for the promotion of local development) located in the countries of the partner and associated universities or in international organisations (350 hours).

MASTER'S DEGREES

Upon the successful completion of all Master activities, including the Project Work defence, the Academic Authorities of the organising Institutions will award a **Joint Master Degree** corresponding to:

- in the Hungarian University system: **mesterképzés (M.A.) (Összehasonlító helyi fejlesztési tanulmányok szakon)** according to the 78. § of the Higher Education Act No. 204 of 2011 and the Decision no. FF/487-1/2013 of Educational Authority (Oktatási Hivatal);
- in the Slovenian University system: **skupni magistrski program**;
- in the German University system: **Mastergrad** according to Art. 18 paragraph 1 HRG, Art. 86 paragraph 1, 86 a paragraph 3 BayHSchG;
- in the Italian University system: **Master di primo livello** according to the DM 509/99 and subsequent revisions, DM 270/04.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to qualify for the programme candidates have to comply with the following requirements:

- 1. a first level (Bachelor) university degree in Economics, Sociology, Political Science, Law, Engineering or an equivalent qualification, i.e. relevant to local development. The degree should correspond to a 180 ECTS study programme. In case of applicants from countries where ECTS is not in place, only the holders of a degree of at least three years, eligible to proceed with master studies in the country of origin, are considered to meet the selection criteria. Only applicants who obtained their degree until the deadline for application can be accepted.
- **2.** satisfactory knowledge of English. Compatibility with this criterion for applying to the programme is initially assessed through self-statement. Shortlisted candidates are requested to provide evidence of their English skills, either through international certificates (e.g. TOEFL, IELTS or similar) or through an online test and skype interview. The level of English knowledge requested for enrolment is B2.

Candidates meeting these requirements will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- 1. Higher educational background and language skills;
- 2. Project Work proposal;
- 3. Motivation and references;
- 4. Post-degree courses and activities;
- 5. An interview may be requested (in person or through telephone or skype) for shortlisted candidates

PARTICIPATION COSTS AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Participation cost (tuition fee and insurance coverage) for Master CoDe: € 3 000 per semester.

The participation cost for Erasmus Mundus scholarship holders will be fully covered by the EM scholarship.

Individuals who have already benefited from an EM Master Course scholarship are not eligible for a second scholarship in order to follow the same or another EM Master Course.

The tuition fee for students of most excellent academic quality yet without EM scholarship may be reduced by up to 50%. This shall be decided by the CoDe International Academic Committee based on the results of the evaluation of the individual applications.

Students will be provided with access to the facilities of the partner universities (library, pc rooms, e-mail and Internet) as well as to the universities' cafeterias and restaurants at student rates.

HOW TO APPLY

The application procedure requires candidates to submit the following forms through the Online Application surface of the Master CoDe website (www.erasmusmundus-code.eu). **Online Application opens on 15th November 2014.**

- Application form;
- Scanned copy of degree certificate;
- Applicants with a non-EU academic qualification that has not been officially recognized as equivalent to a Hungarian, Slovenian, German or Italian degree have to attach an authorised translation into English of the degree certificate;
- Proof of English language knowledge/ Declaration on English language skills
- An original Project Work outline;
- Letter of motivation:
- Two letters of recommendation written by qualified scholars or experts;
- Declaration on eligibility for EM scholarship;
- Declaration on special needs (optional)
- Scanned copy of medical certification in English (if special need is declared, it is compulsory);
- Copy of passport.

Only complete application packages can be accepted. In the absence of any of the above mentioned documents the application shall be excluded from the selection procedure.
