Second year in Innsbruck

The courses of the second year take place at the University of Innsbruck. Students admitted at UniTrento are also requested to enroll at the University of Innsbruck **at the beginning of the first year** (1. October - 30 November).

Students need to fill in an online application first and bring the original documents requested to Innsbruck in order to register in person and pay the Austrian Students' Union Fee within the deadline.

UniTrento will set up a date during the month of November when first year students will be requested to go to Innsbruck to finalise the enrollment.

NB: variations in this procedure may apply for 2020/21 due to the Covid emergency.

NON-EU students should make sure they have a **multiple entry visa** valid in all Schengen countries when they arrive in Trento.

Courses and exams in Innsbruck

Lectures (VO 'Vorlesung') are courses held in lecture format. They introduce the research areas, methods and schools of thought for a given subject.

Introductory seminars (PS 'Proseminare') introduce students interactively to scientific literature through the treatment of selected issues. They convey knowledge and methods of academic work.

Lectures with practical elements (VU 'Vorlesungen verbunden mit Übungen') focus on the practical treatment of concrete scientific tasks that are discussed during the lecture parts of the course.

Almost all of the courses are of the type "VU" or "PS", which means that

- the grade is not based on one final exam but on at least one additional measure, e.g. projects, homework.
- a course of type **VU** typically has a final exam at one fixed date which is announced at the beginning of the semester. That **written exam is only offered once**, since it is only one part of your grade in that course.
- should you happen to take an *elective* course of type **VO** then you will have only one final exam and **up to three dates** on which to take that.

§ 17. Repetition of Examinations

(1) In addition to the three examination repetitions specified in UA § 77, Para. 2, one further repetition is permitted.

(2) Comprehensive board examinations are to be repeated in their entirety if the candidate fails one of the subjects.

(3) If an examination consists of a number of subjects or courses but is not held as a board examination, only the subject or course failed by the candidate is to be repeated.

(4) The third or fourth repetition of a course examination is to be held as a board examination if the examination is conducted as a single examination. The student may also request that this be done for the second repetition of a course examination.

(5) The third or fourth repetition of a subject examination or a module examination is to be held as a board examination. The student may also request that this be done for the second repetition of a course examination.

(6) Failed continuous assessment courses are to be repeated in their entirety.

Master thesis

The final semester is devoted to the master thesis (30 ECTS), which can be carried out either at Innsbruck University or at UniTrento.
