About the kick-off symposium

This symposium is meant to be a highly dynamic discussion among approx 20 legal experts in various fields (ECHR, international private law, EU law, medically assisted procreation, children's rights, international human rights law, comparative constitutional law) in a rather informal environment. Both English and French are working languages, everyone being free to use either of them, without simultaneous translation. No proceedings or formal speeches are envisaged. We prefer a brainstorming approach and an open discussion of ideas on how legal principles not yet applied to such families could help shape future case-law and legislation. The kick-off is meant to help partners collect suggestions and shape their research plan for the next two years.

About the *Rights on the move* project

Rights on the move looks at the European protection of the rights of rainbow families, i.e. families where the parental roles are played by persons of the same legal gender – moving and residing within the EU. The diversity of regulations about marriage and partnership, access to assisted reproductive technologies and adoption exposes these families to considerable obstacles when moving within the EU.

By adopting a child-oriented approach, “Rights on the move” aims at unravelling how freedom of movement should be read in compliance with the EU Charter, the European citizenship rights of the child and other international and supranational instruments.

The project started in January 2013 and will last two years.
