



Erasmus+ green travel allowance

If you are participating in the Erasmus+ Europe programme and you choose to reach your destination and return home using a sustainable means of transport, you are eligible to receive the green travel allowance.

For your trip to be considered "sustainable", you need to **use sustainable transportation** for at least 51% of your total journey (round trip), which includes travelling by:

- train
- bus
- carpooling
- bicycle.

You must keep proof of using the sustainable means of transport (such as tickets, for example) because you will have to submit it to the Mobility office.

Amount of the allowance

The amount of the green travel allowance depends on several factors:

- year/Erasmus+ call (if you don't know the year of the call you applied for, contact your Mobility office);
- type of exchange:
 - long-term study (Erasmus+ for study, Erasmus+ for internship);
 - short term study (BIP - Blended Intensive Programmes, ECIU Mobility)
- status of student with [fewer opportunities](#).

Long-term study

- Call 2023: up to 4 days of daily allowance for the green travel and a 50-euro lump sum.
- Call 2024: up to 6 days of daily allowance for green travel.
- Call 2025: a mileage allowance for standard and green travel. The amount of the allowance is increased in the case of green travels.

Short-term study

- Call 2023: up to 4 days of daily allowance for the green travel and a 50-euro lump sum. This does not apply to students with fewer opportunities, who receive a mileage allowance for standard and green travel. The amount of the allowance is increased in the case of green travels.
- Call 2024: up to 6 days of daily allowance for green travel. A mileage allowance for standard and green travel. The amount of the allowance is increased in the case of green travels.
- Call 2025: up to 6 days of daily allowance for green travel. A mileage allowance for standard and green travel. The amount of the allowance is increased in the case of green travels.
