ERASMUS+ STUDY LONG-TERM MOBILITY PROGRAMME

Academic year 2026-27

PLEASE NOTE

Please note this is a courtesy translation and the only binding version is the Italian one.

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Art. 1 – Object of the selection

1. The present call regulates the selection process and scholarships assignment to spend a mobility period abroad within the Erasmus+ programme in one of the partner universities listed in Attachment 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d for the academic year 2026/27. The pieces of information listed in Attachment 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d may be updated during the opening of the call on the basis of updates from partners. Any follow-up will be available online on [Open Selection Calls](#) and properly notified. Partner universities in the United Kingdom and Switzerland are also included among the destinations managed through this call.

The duration of the mobility shall be minimum 2 and maximum 12 months in the period between 1st June 2026 and 30th September 2027.

Art. 2 – Admission requirements for the selection

1. Except for the specific cases regulated in subsequent paragraph 5, students of the University of Trento who, by the expiration date of this call, meet the requirements set out in Annexes 1a, 1b, 1c, and 1d, and who fall under one of the following conditions, are eligible to participate in the selection process:
 - a. Students enrolled in three-year Bachelor's degree courses or five-year Master's degree courses, two-year Master's degree courses and doctoral courses of the University of Trento. Students enrolled in inter-university degree courses only where courses are managed by the University of Trento¹;
In the case of simultaneous enrolment in two courses at UniTrento, it will only be possible to apply for one of the active careers. In the case of dual enrolment in another Italian or foreign university, it will be possible to apply at both calls, but it will not be possible to carry out two mobility programmes promoted by the two different universities in the same period, under penalty of cancellation of the mobility programme assigned by UniTrento;
 - b. Bachelor degree graduates enrolled in single classes ("corsi singoli") with the purpose to enroll in two-year Master's degree courses at the University of Trento. These students must be enrolled in a Master's degree course at the University of Trento at the moment of their departure.
2. By the deadline of the call candidates must:
 - a. have acquired a minimum number of credits (CFU) recorded in their academic career relative to their year of study, equal to:

- 36 credits (CFU) for students enrolled in the 2nd year of a Bachelor's course or of a five-year Master's course (23 credits for students enrolled in part-time courses);
- 72 credits (CFU) for students enrolled in the 3rd year of a Bachelor's course or in the 3rd or following years of a five-year Master's course (46 credits for students enrolled in part-time courses);

This rule does not apply to: students enrolled in the departments of Mathematics and Physics, participants in the TOPSport programme, students enrolled in the 1st year of a course of study, students enrolled in the 2nd year of a Master's course, students enrolled in single courses, who are not required to have gained any minimum number of credits;

- b. be enrolled in their degree course for a number of years that doesn't exceed the regular duration of the degree course;
- c. prove to have, depending on the Department/Center of afferece, the level of language proficiency indicated in Annex 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d (column "Language level required by the Department by the application's deadline")². This is a mandatory requirement in order to be admitted to the selection.

3. The level of language proficiency shall be certified in one of the following ways by the application deadline:

- a. holding a language certificate among those listed on the language center webpage 3 (the certificate must be uploaded in the online application);
- b. being a native speaker in the required language⁴ (this requirement has to be declared in the online application);
- c. having passed the language exam testing the four abilities (reading, speaking, writing and listening) available in the candidates' UniTrento study plan provided that the language is the same and the level is at least the same as the one required by the partner University (this requirement has to be declared in the online application);

² For each destination, even in the case of dual language areas, you must only select one application language, corresponding to the language of the courses you wish to take at the partner university. However, it is possible to take courses in both languages if you meet the language requirements.

They will be asked to enclose with their application a self-certification stating that they have completed at least the entire course of primary and secondary education in the selected language.



- d. having passed the language exam testing the four abilities in another University, provided that the language is the same and the level is at least the same as the one required by the partner University (this requirement has to be declared by uploading a self-declaration of the passed exams plus the documents attesting the level reached if not already available in the self-declaration);
 - e. holding a high school, Bachelor or Master's Degree diploma either awarded in a country where the official language is the same as the required one or taught in the required language (non-EU citizens have to submit a copy of a written statement by the school/university that awarded the degree and cannot provide a self-declaration);
 - f. having passed **the complete test based on the four skills**, administered by the CLA for the purpose of participating in mobility calls published in previous years, **not more than 5 years ago** (this requirement has to be declared in the online application, specifying the call for which the test was taken);
 - g. being enrolled in an English-taught Degree or in a doctoral course, whose language admission requirements were at least of the same level as the one listed in Attachment 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d (this requirement has to be declared in the online application);
 - h. only for students of the Department of Economics and Management applying for the English linguistic area, having passed the exam of the extra-curricular English course (this requirement has to be declared in the online application);
 - i. only for students of the Faculty of Law applying for the German linguistic area, having passed the Legal German exam at least at a B1 level testing the four abilities (reading, speaking, writing and listening) (this requirement has to be declared in the online application);
 - j. only for Portuguese, Catalan and Serbian: holding a certification issued by universities and/or foreign institution of countries where the official language is respectively Portuguese, Catalan or Serbian (copy of a written statement by the school/university that awarded the degree has to be uploaded in the online application)
4. Applicants who are not able to attest to the fulfillment of the requirement according to one of the methods listed above, may request the inclusion in their study plan of a maximum of two different language tests (English, French, Spanish, German), in accordance with the Didactic Regulations of their bachelor/master Programme. The request must be submitted by December, 17th, 2025 at noon through the online application "[Request to add language tests to the record book for 2026/2027 International Mobility Programs applications](#)" The tests must be taken during the standard sessions organized by CLA and by the deadline of this announcement. For further information check the webpage "Language Requirement"



5. Candidates who have already benefited from a mobility grant in the framework of the Erasmus Programme (Study, Traineeship or International Credit Mobility, Erasmus Mundus) within the same study cycle are admitted to the selection provided that the overall period of time spent abroad with the above mentioned programmes and the one they are now applying for, will not exceed 12 months for the same study course (or 24 months only for 5/6 years-programmes). The months of post-lauream traineeship are counted within the study cycle of the candidate at the time of application. Periods of virtual mobility are excluded from this calculation.
6. Candidates awarded with another mobility grant are not eligible to the present call if the two mobility periods overlap. Participants of the Double Degree Program can apply for this call provided that they complete all the planned exams (taken abroad) by the beginning of the Erasmus Mobility, and they carry out only thesis research at the hosting University. The city or the campus of the thesis research activity must be different from the one where the Double Degree Program took place. In this case it is mandatory to have a written declaration signed by both the University of Trento tutor and the Partner University tutor, stating that the mobility period abroad is compatible with the Double Degree programme.

Art. 3 – Requirements for starting the mobility

1. The mobility periods must mandatorily conclude within the standard duration of the degree programme plus one year, i.e., at the latest during the first year after the regular duration of the programme.
2. Before leaving for the mobility period abroad the student must:
 - a. be regularly enrolled for the 2026/27 academic year in the study programme for which the Erasmus+ destination was assigned, by paying the university fees or renewing enrollment with a request for benefits from Opera Universitaria or UniTrento. In the case of Bachelor's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, to be enrolled at least in the second year of study. For PhD students, this means not being in suspension (i.e., being actively enrolled);
 - b. possess, in relation to the assigned destination and by the deadlines indicated by the partner university, the requirements stipulated in Annexes 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d, specifically in the column 'Language level indicated by partner university,' and any other requirements noted in the column "Notes to be read carefully". The proofs of language knowledge considered valid for the admission are indicated in art. 2 of the present call, unless the hosting university requires additional certificates/level. The candidate must check deadlines and regulations for applying and sending



documents to the hosting institution considering that some documents might be required already during the application phase.

2. Recipients of the Erasmus grant must not receive during the Erasmus mobility period other grants to carry out study, work or research abroad awarded by the European Commission.

Art. 4 – Application procedure

1. Applications have to be made online **only** at the link indicated at the University's webpage [Open selection calls](#). The application must be completed online **by January, 26th 2026 at noon (CET)**. In case of difficulties or technical problems with the online applications please refer to the contacts stated in Art. 11 well in advance of the deadline. It will not be possible to modify or cancel application forms that have been definitively submitted and saved subsequently
2. Candidates may select a maximum of **4 destinations** specifying their order of preference⁵ and the semester of mobility. Candidates can be assigned only one destination in the framework of this call for applications.
3. Candidates may select only destinations offered by their Department at the moment of their application. Students from interdepartmental courses can choose from all the destinations offered by all the Departments involved in their study course within the maximum limit of the 4 preferences referred to in the preceding paragraph 2.
4. By choosing the destinations students are urged to carefully consider the following aspects:
 - a. level of the course of study to be enrolled in during the mobility: it must be compatible with the level of one's course of study or to the course you will be enrolled in in 2026/27;
 - b. duration/months per place: durations compatible with the months of mobility still allowed in one's course of study must be considered
 - c. disciplinary area (ISCED): must be compatible with one's course of study;
 - d. educational offer of the foreign university
5. All candidates have to upload the following documents to the application either in the *.doc* or in the *.docx* or in the *.pdf* format:

- a. a study project or a thesis research project for each chosen destination according to the models available in Annex 2 and 3. For the study project, in addition to the reasons for the choice, the courses intended to be attended at the host university must be indicated; for thesis research, it is necessary to attach the project intended to be carried out abroad, countersigned by the applicant's supervisor;
 - b. if applicable (see art. 2 point 3) a certificate proving the knowledge of the required language;
 - c. in case of mobility for thesis research an acceptance letter/email from the host institution supervisor or from the partner University;
 - d. in case the candidate holds a foreign degree, a copy of the degree indicating the final grade (if available) or the GPA (Grade Point Average).
6. Students with citizenship in one of the Countries participating in the Erasmus programme cannot choose as destinations Universities in their home Country.
7. Candidates with special needs are invited to contact the offices through the addresses in Art. 11 in order to identify additional documentation and/or support that might be useful.

Art. 5 – Selection, Evaluation criteria and Ranking list

1. Before the starting of the selection process, the following will be verified by the administrative office:
 - a. the completeness of the documentation attached to the regularly submitted online applications, with reference to the provisions of Article 4 of this call;
 - b. the possession by the candidates of the admission requirements referred to in Article 2 of this call. 2.
2. Candidates who are found not to possess the admission requirements referred to in Article 2 will be excluded from the selection process.
3. The Department/Centre Commissions, appointed by Rectoral Decree, will evaluate only those applications admitted to the selection process because they are complete with all elements as stipulated in Article 4.
4. The Departmental Commission's evaluation criteria are determined as follows:
 - a. Study or thesis research project;



- b. Level of language knowledge;
- c. GPA of graded exams registered by 31st October 2025. Students enrolled in single classes or in the first year of a two-year Master's Degree with less than 18 registered credits (with marks) will be evaluated on the basis of the final mark of the degree they have previously completed; in case of degrees obtained abroad the GPA will be considered if there is not a final grade;
- d. Specific criteria valid for each Department/Centre according to the following table:

5. The final scores will be assigned on a 100 points scale, each Commission will decide if a minimum score is required for admission.
6. The final ranking list will be published on each Department/Centre website by **March, 31st 2026**.
7. The final rankings will be published anonymously, with reference only to the Application ID. The Application ID can be found in the confirmation email automatically sent by the system upon submission of the application, or in [My Applications](#) on MyUnitn.

Art. 6 – Destination acceptance

1. Destinations will be assigned by **April, 30th 2026** according to the terms indicated by each Center/Department; destinations that may become available can be re-assigned by and no later than **September, 30th 2026**.
2. Destinations will be assigned choosing among the four ones listed by the student in the application according to the student's ranking position, destinations' order of preference and availability.
3. In case the winning candidate withdraws the next eligible candidate in the ranking list may be assigned the newly available destination.
4. The Commission may propose to the eligible students another destination coherent to their linguistic and study area if there are no more available places for the destinations chosen by the candidate in the application.
5. The Erasmus+ grant awarded is conditional on admission to the host institution. In the event of rejection, there is no provision for relocation to another university. It is the student's responsibility to check the specific requirements (language, enrolment, access to courses) and the deadlines for applying for admission (application deadline) at the host university by consulting the websites or contacting the universities.



6. Recipients who have won a mobility grant for the same period within the framework of another International Mobility Programme must renounce the assigned mobility in order to accept the new awarded destination. The sole exceptions are students of the Double Degree Program mentioned in Art. 2, point 5.

Art. 7 - Activities abroad and mobility period

1. Selected students must be regularly enrolled to the University of Trento for the whole mobility period duration.
2. The University of Trento guarantees the recognition of all the activities carried out abroad if certified by the hosting institution with a Transcript of Records and if present in the Learning Agreement for Studies. It will not be possible to reject grades for examinations entered in the Transcript of Records as passed and previously entered in the Learning Agreement for studies.
3. Subject to any limitations provided for by individual institutional agreements and the relevant Departments/Faculties, the following activities may be included in the Learning Agreement for studies abroad
 - a. attendance of university courses with related examinations;
 - b. thesis research activities
 - c. internship/internship period associated with course attendance, provided that it is under the supervision of the destination university.
4. In case partner universities allow it, students can carry out the mobility in *blended mode* provided that they abide by the rule of a minimum of two months 'physically' spent at the host university.
5. The Departments of Economics and Management and Psychology and Cognitive Science offer the opportunity to carry out thesis research activities abroad in the framework of the Erasmus+ programme only to students enrolled in a Master's degree course.
6. The duration of the mobility period indicated in Attachment 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d is indicative. The actual duration of the mobility period will be attested by the partner university at the end of the experience and may be shorter or longer than that initially assigned. It will be possible to submit a request for an extension of mobility within the deadline communicated by the International Mobility Offices. Authorisation for the extension of mobility guarantees insurance cover and recognition of the activities carried out.
7. Selected students are requested to:
 - a. check the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation website notices about safety and risky situation abroad;
 - b. accept the decisions of the partner universities about attendance modality, restrictions caused by epidemics, pandemics or other causes of force majeure;



- c. subscribe a travel insurance in case of cancellation or delays caused by epidemics, pandemics or other causes of force majeure;
 - d. subscribe an international health insurance covering costs for hospitalization and treatment due to epidemics and pandemics;
 - e. find out (autonomously) information about visa requirements;
 - f. in the case of possession of a residence permit or temporary protection, find out about the regulations in Italy and in the host country. If necessary, renew the documents in time for the start of the mobility;
 - g. inquire in advance about the cost of living in the country of destination and, also for the purposes of issuing the visa, about the economic guarantees required for the entire period of mobility (proof of solvency).
8. For the period of study abroad, students continue to pay tuition fees at the University of Trento and therefore the host university may not request payment of tuition fees.

Art. 8 – Mobility Grant

1. The grant is paid according to the participation in the physical mobility and activities in two installments:
 - a. 70% of the grant by the start of the mobility, whenever possible;
 - b. The remaining part after the end of the mobility and after completing the mobility documentation.
2. Following the requirement of the European Commission, the University of Trento differentiates the Erasmus Study grants according to the destination Country as detailed below:
 - a. 400,00 €/month (30 days) for mobilities in the following Countries: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Iceland, Luxembourg, Liechtenstein, The Netherlands, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, Faroe Island;
 - b. 350,00 €/month (30 days) for mobilities in the following Countries: Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, North Macedonia, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Turkey.

However, the amount of the scholarships for the a.y. 2026/2027 could be potentially increased according to the national regulation. In that case students awarded with the scholarship will be promptly informed.



3. Students with fewer certified opportunities⁶, including socio-economic status confirmed by the ISEE value University 2026⁷ (ISEE equal to or less than € 25,000), may receive an additional European contribution of € 250/month (30 days).
4. The total amount of the grant payable is defined on the basis of the actual duration of the mobility in terms of days.
5. Participants with medically certified physical, mental or health conditions can benefit from the services offered by the University Inclusion Office. In case of mobilities towards one of the Erasmus+ Programme Countries they can also apply for an additional European monthly contribution to the Erasmus National Agency/Indire through the University of Trento to cover real costs in case the monthly integration of 250,00 € is not sufficient. In case of rejection of the request by the National Agency for lack of funding, the University of Trento intervenes. The additional financial contribution for students with special needs will be granted at the end of the mobility period on the basis of actual costs.
6. Students assigned to an Erasmus+ destination in Switzerland or the UK⁸ must inform the host university that their mobility takes place and is funded under the Erasmus+ programme. For Swiss destinations, it is necessary to check the compatibility of the Erasmus grant received with funding through the Swiss-European Mobility Programme, should this be made available by the host university.
7. A travel contribution is foreseen, the amount of which varies according to the distance band calculated using the "[Distance calculator](#)" made available by the European Commission. For the calculation of the distance band, the city of Trento is considered the 'point of departure' and the legal headquarters of the Host Institution is considered the 'point of destination'. A Green Travel top-up is foreseen if the majority of the outward and return journey is undertaken using sustainable means (train, bus, shared car, bicycle). The amounts corresponding to each distance band are listed in the table below.

8. In case of withdrawal or interruption of the study period before having spent at least 2 months abroad (except the major force cases), the student is requested to give back the study grant received. The repayment is also required if the student does not reach the minimum amount of credits⁹ according to the length of the mobility as specified in the table below:

Grant repayment is a necessary condition for the renewal of enrolment to the next academic year or the admission to the final exam.

9. The mobility grant is to be considered as a contribution to the mobility period, it does not give access to social security treatments nor evaluation towards juridical and economic careers, nor automatic recognition for social security objectives and is subjected to the deductions foreseen by the law. In case of blended mobility, the grant will not be paid for the periods spent as virtual mobility (spent in Italy or another country which is not the country of destination).

Art. 9 – Selection and mobilities for Doctoral students

1. With reference to Article 2, PhD students must possess knowledge of the language indicated in Annexes 1a, 1b, 1c, column 'linguistic area', for the destination(s) of interest, at least at the level reported in the table:

Psychology and Cognitive Sciences Area	Language level as reported in the Annex 1c, column: "language level required by the Department/Center by the application's deadline"
Humanities and Social Sciences Area	English B2 Level and/or B1 level for any other language (French, Portuguese, Spanish, Catalan, German)

Doctoral students can apply for a destination whose working language is not the same as the one indicated in Attachment 1a, 1b, 1c if previously approved by their supervisor. The level required for applying is the one enlisted in the table above.

2. With reference to Article 3, at the moment of departure for the period abroad, the PhD student must possess, in relation to the assigned destination and by the deadlines indicated by the partner university, the requirements stipulated in Annexes 1a, 1b, 1c, column 'Language level indicated by partner university'. The methods of linguistic certification are those indicated in Article 2, paragraph 3, unless otherwise specifically stipulated by the partner university. It is the responsibility of the PhD student to verify the deadlines and methods for submitting the aforementioned documentation to the partner university, which may be requested during the phase of sending their data to the host university (application).
3. With reference to Article 4 – Submission of the application for participation, PhD students must attach the following documents to the appropriate sections of the online application in one of the following formats: .pdf, .doc, .docx:



- a. the study/research project for each chosen destination, countersigned by their supervisor, according to the template in Annex 4. In addition to the reasons for the choice, the courses intended to be attended, if applicable, or the research project intended to be carried out abroad, and any authorization to apply for a destination for which the vehicular language used for the training activity does not coincide with the linguistic area provided for in Annexes 1a, 1b, 1c, must be indicated.
 - b. any certifications proving linguistic knowledge for the language(s) of interest referred to in Article 2, paragraph 3, letters a., d., e., h., j;
 - c. approval letter from the hosting institution or supervisor at the hosting institution (an approval via email is sufficient);
 - d. in case the master's degree was obtained abroad, candidates have to enclose a copy of the diploma including final mark (if available) or GPA.
4. **With reference to Article 5 – Methods for conducting the selection process, evaluation criteria, and outcome of the selection, the Departmental Commission shall draw up a specific ranking list for PhD students**, compiled by applying the following criteria to which the Commission shall assign the relevant scores:
- a. Level of language knowledge (according to the criteria that each committee will decide to adopt);
 - b. Study or research project;
 - c. Final mark of the of the Master's degree diploma or GPA if the final mark is not available;
 - d. Other possible criteria established before the selection occurs.
5. Doctoral students will be assigned with destinations reserved to doctoral students specified in Attachment 1a, 1b, 1c. If a destination is open both to undergraduate/graduate and doctoral students the priority will be assigned to undergraduate/graduate students.
6. With reference to Art. 8, for doctoral students there is no integration for minor opportunities socio-economic condition confirmed by the ISEE value University 2026.
7. Doctoral students must be regularly enrolled at the University of Trento for the whole duration of the mobility, i.e. they must not have suspended their studies.
8. As for activities carried out abroad, in the absence of a Transcript of Records listing the ECTS credits, the PhD student must submit an official certification from the host institution at the end of the mobility period, confirming the research activity undertaken. This certification must be sent to the International Mobility Office for the disbursement of the grant and to the PhD program's administrative office for the recognition of



the research activity. It is the responsibility of the PhD student to check with the PhD program's administrative office the terms for recognition.

9. For matters not regulated in this article, the provisions indicated for students shall be considered valid.

Art. 10 - Information on the processing of personal data

1. The University of Trento shall process the personal data provided under this Call in compliance with the University's policies, in observance of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 ('GDPR') and Legislative Decree no. 196 of 30 June 2003 and subsequent amendments and additions.
2.
