



# Erasmus+ travel allowance

The Erasmus+ programme provides a travel allowance for students participating in its mobility schemes.

## Amount of the allowance

The amount of the travel allowance is different for:

- long-term exchanges (Erasmus+ for study, Erasmus+ internship);
- short term exchanges (BIPs - Blended Intensive Programmes, ECIU Mobility);
- and when sustainable means of transportation are used.

### Long-term mobility

- **Call 2025:** the participants receive a kilometric allowance in any case (the amount is greater for green travels).

### Short-term mobility

- **Call 2024 and call 2025:** up to 6 days of scholarship for green travel days. The participants receive a kilometric allowance in any case, with an increased amount in case of green travels.

**For a trip to be considered "sustainable"** at least 51% of the total kilometres of the journey (round trip) must be travelled using a sustainable means of transport, that is:

- train;
- bus;
- carpooling;
- bicycle.

You must keep proof (through the tickets, for example) of the use of sustainable vehicles, as you will have to submit the required documents to the Mobility office.



## Kilometric allowance

The contribution for travel expenses varies according to distance travelled, which is calculated using the "[Distance calculator](#)" made available by the European Commission. Rates are as follows:

Travel distance	Green travel (amount per participant)	Ordinary travel (amount per participant)
Between 10 and 99 km	56 Euro	28 Euro
Between 100 and 499 km	285 Euro	211 Euro
Between 500 and 1999 km	417 Euro	309 Euro
Between 2000 and 2999 km	535 Euro	395 Euro
Between 3000 and 3999 km	785 Euro	580 Euro
Between 4000 and 7999 km	1188 Euro	1188 Euro
8000 km or more	1735 Euro	1735 Euro

The city of Trento is considered as the "starting point" for all exchanges and the headquarters of the host University as the "destination".
