Art. 1 – SUBJECT OF THE CALL

1. The University of Trento announces the 42nd cycle of the Doctoral Programme in **Cognitive and Brain Sciences** for the 2026/2027 academic year.

3. Topic-specific grants are conditional to the execution of a particular research topic for which specific skills are required. Those interested in these grants should carefully check the topic and required skillset indicated on the web page <http://phd.unitn.it/drcimec/topic-specific-grants>.
4. Furthermore, candidates selected by dedicated committees are also eligible for cycle 42, as they are involved in specific international mobility programs in which the University of Trento participates.
5. The number of places covered by scholarships and/or by internship contracts and by other potential financial support may be increased by funds from other universities, public research bodies or prestigious private companies, that become available after the publication of this announcement and before the oral examination. Such occurrence will be communicated online, and nowhere else, at this [selection’s webpage](#).

7. IMPORTANT

- a) The dates of the selection process and all results (interim and final), any exclusion ex officio from the selection due to incomplete applications (see Art. 4 below), and exclusion due to foreign qualifications not recognized as eligible (see Art. 2 below), will be published on the competition webpage, with reference made **solely to the application ID, which applicants are advised to note carefully**. This publication shall serve as official notification for all legal purposes and no personal communications will be sent.
- b) Without prejudice to the provisions of this article and the following art. 5 co. 7 and 6 co. 5, any notifications relating to the application will be emailed to the address linked to the account registered upon application. Candidates who are still enrolled or have recently graduated from the University of Trento are advised to check that their email address is valid at this link: [Profile data](#). Art. 2 – ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Applications for admission to the selection process are accepted from candidates regardless of nationality, who hold:
 - a. an Italian “Laurea Specialistica o Magistrale” (Master’s Degree) according to Ministerial Decree no. 270 of 22 October 2004, or a university degree awarded under the previous Italian regulations;
 - b. or a second-level degree awarded by an Italian “AFAM” Institute (Artistic, Musical and Choreutics Higher Education);
 - c. or an equivalent degree qualification obtained abroad (Master’s Degree) at a recognized academic institution, which:
 - allow access to PhD programs within the reference system of the issuing country;
 - is equivalent to the Italian *Laurea Magistrale* (Master’s Degree), in terms of duration, level¹ and subject area²;
 - is considered suitable³ by the Admission Committee for the sole purpose of admission to the PhD Programme.
2. Applications are also accepted from candidates who do not hold the required degree but expect to obtain it, **by 31 October 2026**. In this cases admission is "conditional" and applicants must submit the degree certificate or a self-declaration to the PhD Office - Cognitive, Social Sciences and Humanities (email: phd.office-cssh@unitn.it) **no later than November 6, 2026. Failure to provide the certificate will lead to exclusion.**
3. **It’s in the applicant’s best interest to provide all elements necessary for evaluation, especially in case the educational system of the country where the title was obtained is not comparable with the Italian one.**
The Evaluation Committee reserves the right to ask applicants to provide additional documentation, if deemed necessary, in order to be considered for the selection.

- c) Candidates who have already obtained a PhD degree can apply for a second PhD Programme only if its main research topics and scientific-disciplinary fields are different from those of the candidate's first Doctoral Programme. For applicants who have already benefited - even partially - from a doctoral scholarship in the past, the admission to the new PhD Programme can't be covered by a scholarship⁴.
- d) The list of candidates' IDs whose academic degree has been considered not eligible for the admission selection by the Evaluation Committee will be available at the [selection's webpage](#).

Art. 3 – THE DOCTORATE PROGRAMME

1. The educational programme takes advantage of the strengths of the Center for Mind/Brain Sciences (CIMEC), namely the multi-disciplinary nature of the Center and of its faculty and the availability of cutting-edge research Laboratories.
2. The doctorate programme offers a multidisciplinary education that allows doctoral students to acquire skills in specific areas of fundamental and applied research. The programme encourages professional development in innovative and experimental fields that span different scientific areas.
3. Doctoral students are expected to play an active role in their education by taking part in seminars, workshops and training courses. An integral part of this training is the research-based thesis.

Art. 4 – APPLICATION

1. The application must be completed and submitted by **May 7, 2026 - 4:00 p.m. (Italian time)**, exclusively through the online system: <https://www.unitn.it/en/apply/dott> which will be available within three working days from the date of publication of the notice. Applicants can access the online registration procedure in one of the following ways⁵:

- **with a SPID account or CIE** (Electronic Identity Card): those who have an Italian Tax Code (codice fiscale) and an Italian identity document must access the registration with CIE (more information at <https://www.cartaidentita.interno.gov.it/en/home/>) or with SPID, the Italian Public Digital Identity System, which automatically certifies the identity of the person on the UniTrento systems and sets up an @unitn.it account.

2. Participation in the selection process is subject to the payment of a non-reimbursable application fee of **€30.00 by pagoPa system**⁶, as indicated in the appropriate section of the application ('Selection participation fee').
 3. **Administration highly recommends that candidates make sure to have received the notification email confirming that their application has been successfully completed and submitted.**
UniTrento refuses any responsibility for all those applications not properly closed by candidates.
 4. Candidates will be considered totally responsible of their applications. Incomplete or irregular applications, missing attachments, non-payment of the participation fee, or applications transmitted in ways other than those set out in this article, shall not be considered valid and candidates will consequently be excluded from the selection process.
 5. All applicants are admitted to the selection **conditionally upon ascertaining that they fulfil the admission requirements.**
The University of Trento has the right to verify the documents delivered pursuant to articles 71 et seq. of the Presidential Decree n. 445 of the 28.12.2000.
 6. **A candidate whose submitted degree does not satisfy the requirements specified in art. 2 or if the information provided in the application is not true, may be excluded at any time from the selection process or even after enrolment and the beginning of the PhD course.**
 7. According to Italian Law n. 104/92, Art. 20 and to Italian Law n. 68/99, Art. 16 (1), applicants with special needs or with learning disabilities, according to their particular disability may explicitly request special assistance or extra time during the examinations in their online application. In this regard, the data will be processed in compliance with the regulations in force as indicated in the information on the processing of personal data.
 8. Candidates are asked to enter information regarding the qualification required for admission to the PhD programme in the 'Degrees' section. Specifically, candidates should add the "classe di Laurea" (degree subject area), the awarding university, the award date (or expected award date), and the final grade.
 9. **COMPULSORY ATTACHMENTS** (failure to upload one or more compulsory attachments results in expulsion from the selection)⁷:
 - A. Identity document (ID):**
a copy of the **identity card** (for EU citizens) **or** of the **passport** (pages with photo, personal data, place and time of issue of the document, expiration date of the document);
 - B. Documents related to the academic degree:**
 - **Italian qualification**
already obtained/to be obtained: a self-certification, made by means of a **declaration in lieu of certification** pursuant to art. 46 of Presidential Decree 28.12.2000, n. 445 and subsequent amendments, certifying the list of exams taken, reporting the date of passing them, credits acquired and grade. A **fac-simile** is available for download on the [selection's webpage](#) but similar documents are also accepted as long as they report the information requested in the call. If the qualification was issued by the University of Trento, the information will be acquired automatically.

- a **certificate attesting to the possession of a second level university qualification** (see art. 2 paragraph 1 letter c), issued by the institution that awarded it. The certificate must indicate the type of diploma, the date it was awarded and the relative grade;
- the **list of examinations taken to obtain the qualification to access a Doctoral Programme** (Academic Transcript of Records of the Master's degree) with relative credits (if provided for in the university system of the country that awarded the qualification), marks, and rating scale. If the university studies carried out abroad are divided into first and second level, the Bachelor's degree and the list of examinations taken to obtain that degree (academic transcript of records of the Bachelor's degree) should also be attached.

If the foreign academic qualification has already been recognized as equivalent⁸ to a second cycle Italian qualification **by the competent academic bodies of Italian universities**, the equivalence provision (Rectoral Decree) must be attached in the appropriate section of the online application.

- **to be obtained (the following two points refer to foreign degree applicants who have not yet obtained their degree, who expect to complete it by October 31, 2026 and are therefore “conditionally” admitted to the selection):**
 - a **certificate of enrolment in a course of study that allows admission to a Doctoral Programme** (see art. 2 paragraph 1 letter c), with a **list of the examinations** successfully passed, credits obtained in each examination (if provided for in the university system of the country that awarded the qualification), marks, rating scale (academic transcript of records) and the possible award date. If the university studies carried out abroad are divided into first and second level, the Bachelor's degree and the list of examinations taken to obtain that degree (academic transcript of records of the Bachelor's degree) should also be attached.

If the aforementioned documents are different from Italian or English, they must be accompanied by a translation in Italian or in English, made provisionally by the applicant who takes responsibility for the accuracy of the translation and its compliance with the original text, in order to allow the Admission Committee to evaluate the eligibility of the certificate, for the sole purpose of participation participating in this admissions process.

In addition, if available, also the following documents:

- Academic degree (diploma) of the required title (Master of Science/Art or equivalent) in the original language;
- *Diploma Supplement*⁹(according to the model developed by the European Commission, the Council of Europe and UNESCO / CEPES), or;
- *Declaration of value*¹⁰ which certifies that the educational qualification is valid in the country of achievement for being admitted to Doctoral Programme (third level of higher education according to the Bologna Process - European Higher Education Area; EQF level 8), or;
- the *Statement of comparability - university qualification*¹¹ awarded by the ENIC-NARIC Center in Italy (CIMEA) that contains all the information necessary for the evaluation of the qualification.

C. Curriculum vitae in English, up-to-date and dated (preferably based on the [Europass model](#)), including any other academic titles or qualifications obtained (such as II level Masters degrees, Doctorates, specializations, high level specialty courses, etc.). Further declarations from the candidate pertaining to previous experiences are filled out by the candidates in the online application “Curriculum Statement” section.

D. Research Statement (available on the [selection's webpage](#)) in English that consists in:

- **Part A** – Background and Motivation Letter;
- **Part B** – Statement of Research Interest;
- **Part C** – Research Project Proposal.

The aim of the research project proposal is such that the applicant may demonstrate his/her ability to express and evaluate hypotheses. **Only one Research Statement is allowed per candidate.**

Candidates competing for a topic-specific scholarship must express their interest in the online application and submit a proposal whose subject is relevant to the research area of the scholarship.

Candidates are strongly advised to consult <http://phd.unitn.it/drcimec/research-topics>, which lists the research topics of the Doctorate and relative proponent (potential supervisor of the thesis), as well as <https://phd.unitn.it/drcimec/topic-specific-grants> which lists topic-specific grants, their descriptions and supervisors. With the exception of topic-specific grants, the candidate should be aware that pointing out potential supervisor/s in the application is in no way binding to the actual final appointment of the supervisor on behalf of the Doctoral Programme Committee.

10. In a specific section of the online application you will be also required to declare that your knowledge of the **English language** is equal to or above CEFR B2 level. Advanced knowledge of the English language is a **fundamental prerequisite** in order to participate in the PhD programme. In this section it will also be possible to upload, if available, a certificate ¹²proving your level of English knowledge or a document proving that you attended a High School, Bachelor's or Master's level course entirely in English. If no English certificate is provided then the candidate's English knowledge will be tested during the interview.

11. OPTIONAL ATTACHMENTS:

- a) Up to **two Academic Reference Forms**¹³ filled out by experts structured as University staff or in national or international research organizations. Within 24 hours of completing and saving the *Referees* section in the application, the system sends an email directly to the referees listed by the applicant with the attached form and instructions on how to fill it out and transmit it to the University. It is highly recommended that applicants verify that their referees send the *Academic Reference Form* no later than **May 10, 2026**;
- b) List of publications and presentations;
- c) Other titles, such as international tests (i.e. GRE or equivalent);
- d) Other documentation useful to attest the candidate's research skills and abilities (documentation pertaining to awards, academic activity and post-degree research, etc).
- e) **- If the qualification has not yet been obtained**, a declaration must also be attached from the thesis supervisor, or other academic or administrative manager/staff, specifying that the academic qualification is expected to be acquired by the student by 31 October 2026.

12. Should candidates wish to add and/or change further documentation to the application after having already submitted the application, they may do so **by the deadline of the selection announcement** emailing ateneo@unitn.it. In this case, **the subject line should be:** *Application ID - Candidate's Last Name and Name – Doctoral Course in Cognitive and Brain Sciences 42nd cycle - "integrazione domanda"*, and the body of the email should contain a note explaining the purpose of the additional or changed attached documentation¹⁴. **Documentation sent by other means will not be accepted.**

13. The application is to be considered for all purposes in law as a self-certification of personal data and declared qualifications.

Art. 5 – APPLICANT EVALUATION

1. Upon hearing the Doctoral Programme Committee, the Rector appoints the Admissions Committee. It consists of at least three members chosen among Italian and foreign professors and researchers, who are experts in the scientific areas of the Doctorate. The Committee may also include up to two experts, even foreign, of public and private national and international research organizations.
2. The selection exams are intended to assess the applicant's preparation and aptitude towards scientific research with specific reference to the chosen research topic.
3. The selection takes place as follows:
 - evaluation of the qualifications and the Research Statement presented by the candidate in the application (described above in Art. 4.9);

- an interview examination in English intended to assess clarity of exposition, mastery of the English language, knowledge of the subject matter relating to the research project presented, the ability to summarise and disseminate the expected results of the proposed project.
 - active and passive English language skills of the candidate will also be verified.
4. In case of interest in competing also for the **topic-specific grants** indicated in art. 1 of this call, the candidates must specify it in the application and must present a **project relevant to the topic**. Candidates who intend to obtain eligibility also for any **topic-specific grants added after the publication of the call**, must make an explicit request to the examining commission **before the interview** according to the methods that will be specified on the [selection's webpage](#). For the aforementioned candidates, the interview will include an assessment of the skills on the specific topic of the grant.
 5. The request for the awarding of a topic-specific grant, made in the application or through a specific request submitted to the Commission, implies the candidate's preference for the awarding of that specific scholarship over all other scholarships.
 6. Criteria and evaluation methods of selection are as follows
 - Up to 60 points for the qualifications' assessment divided in the following way:
 - a) From 0 to 20 points for academic career
 - b) From 0 to 40 points for the Research Statement
 - Up to 60 points for the interview exam.

In order to be **admitted to the interview** candidates must reach a minimum score of 36/60 in the academic career and research project.

The oral examination is considered passed with a minimum score of 36/60.

7. The results of the qualifications' assessment and of the exam interview will be published at the [selection's webpage](#)¹⁵.
8. The candidate may choose to be interviewed in one of the following two ways:
 - a) in presence, at the University of Trento.

In this case the candidate must show a valid ID document before the interview begins. Should the candidate fail to attend the interview for whatever reason this will be considered as renunciation of participation in the selection procedure;
 - b) by videoconference through the use of audio-video connection tools that allow the correct identification of the participants (through a webcam) and carrying out the interview in public.

The starting time of the interviews is established by the Commission. The candidate must first show the same identity document attached to the application. Failure to connect or unavailability at the established date and time or failure to show the identification document, will result in exclusion from the selection. The University assumes no responsibility in the event of technical problems that do not guarantee the proper conduct of the interview.
9. The indication of the date and time and of the place (seat of the University of Trento, if in presence) where the interview will be held will be provided at least 20 days prior to the date of the interview on the [selection's webpage](#).

Any changes in the date of the examination will be published on this same web page.

Art. 6 – RANKING

1. The Committee draws up a merit-based ranking according to the scores obtained by the applicants from the qualification's assessment, the project (research statement, Part C – Research Project Proposal) and the interview.
2. Scholarships are assigned to eligible candidates based on:
 - a) Ranking order;
 - b) candidate eligibility for topic-specific grants. Please note that topic-specific grants are assigned following the ranking and until their maximum number is filled.
3. The candidate who has been awarded a topic-specific grant, must accept it since the choice for a topic-specific grant he/she expressed implies the candidate's preference for the award of that specific scholarship with respect to the others.

Renouncing the topic-specific grant implies the exclusion of the candidate from the right to enroll in the PhD Programme.
4. Unassigned topic-specific grants will result in the reduction of positions available.
5. The ranked list (using candidates' application IDs) will be published on the [selection's webpage](#).
6. **By publishing the ranking, notification concerning the selection results is considered fulfilled.** Admitted candidates will not receive any personal messages.

Art. 7 – ADMISSION TO THE DOCTORAL PROGRAMME AND ACCEPTANCE OF THE OFFER

1. Applicants will be admitted to the Doctorate according to their rank in the final score list and until all available and eligible positions have been filled.
2. In case of equally ranked candidates, the candidate's economic situation shall be the deciding factor, in accordance with the Decree of the President of the Council of Ministers (D.P.C.M.) of 9 April 2001 as amended.
3. If an eligible applicant **withdraws before the beginning of the Programme** (1st November 2026), the next applicant in the ranking list will be offered the place.

This candidate is expected to accept the offer **within 8 days** from the day after having received the notice from the PhD Office - Cognitive, Social Sciences and Humanities.

If an eligible applicant withdraws or is excluded in the first three-month term of the first year, the Doctoral Programme Committee may decide to fill the vacancy with another candidate next in rank in the final score list.

4. Admitted applicants must accept the offer **within 8 days** from the day following the day of publication of the final ranking list by submitting the online application available at <https://www.unitn.it/en/study/register/information-phd-students/enrolling-phd>. Those who do not confirm acceptance within the terms and according to the methods indicated in this paragraph will be considered as having renounced and the corresponding place will be made available to the candidates classified as suitable, according to the order of the ranking.
5. Admitted applicants with a qualification that has not been awarded in Italy must deliver to the PhD Office - Cognitive, Social Sciences and Humanities, in advance by email (PhD.office-cssh@unitn.it) if they had not already done so during the application phase, the following documents **by November 6, 2026**:
 - original or certified copy of the academic diploma of the *Master degree* (Master of Science/Arts or equivalent) together with the academic transcript of records, possible official translations¹⁶, legalized¹⁷ or with an apostille affixed (verify the fulfilment of the requirements set by the issuing country of the title);
 - *Diploma Supplement* (if provided for by the university where the title was issued, it is commonly used within the member countries of the European Higher Education Area (EHEA))

alternatively

 - *Declaration of Value* issued by the Italian diplomatic or consular representations country of origin of the institution that issued the title

alternatively

 - *Statement of comparability of foreign university qualifications*¹⁸ issued by the ENIC-NARIC Center in Italy (CIMEA) that contains all the information necessary for the assessment of the qualification.

In case the Diploma Supplement, or the Declaration of Value, or the Statement of comparability are not available by **November 6, 2026**, admitted applicants must deliver a document showing that they asked the University/the Italian diplomatic or consular representations/the ENIC-NARIC center for the documents to be issued. Admission to the Doctoral Programme for successful candidates who do not provide the required above-mentioned documents by November 6, 2026 will be "conditional" and the applicants will be excluded from the Doctoral Programme if:

- they do not deliver the documents within 6 months from the starting date of the Programme;
- upon verification, their title is not in compliance with the requirements of this call for selection.

Forfeiture from the course will result in the obligation to return any monthly scholarship money received.

Art. 8 – ENROLMENT

1. The official registration in the doctorate, limited to short-listed candidates who have accepted the position according to the procedures in the preceding article, will automatically be made official as soon as the PhD Programmes' requirements verification by the Ministry of Education, University and Research for the 2026-2027 a.y. has been completed.
2. In case of no conferrable accreditation, candidates who have accepted the position will receive a timely notification via email and the local education tax (TDS) will be refunded.

3. To complete enrolment, the candidate who has obtained the qualification abroad, upon arrival in Italy, will have to show the official documents (in original or copy conforming to the original), related to the academic path, already anticipated in a scanned form during admission to the selection or during the matriculation process, in order to allow the appropriate verification of the validity of the qualifications, also by means of the national information centers on the recognition of foreign titles as part of the ENIC-NARIC network. Until such time, candidates are admitted to the course *conditionally* and may be excluded if they do not meet these requirements.

Art. 9 - INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS OF RESEARCH FINDINGS AND PUBLICATIONS

1. Without prejudice to the Italian law on copyright (legislative decree 633/1941 and subsequent amendments), intellectual and industrial property rights on the results eventually achieved by the doctoral student, including (but not limited to) software, industrial inventions patentable or not, know-how, models, data and data collection, are regulated in accordance with applicable laws and University regulations and, if necessary, according to the provisions in the individual agreements with universities, companies or entities involved¹⁹.
2. Before the start of the research activity, the doctoral student is required to sign a specific declaration of commitment to confidentiality in relation to the information, data and documents of a confidential nature that he / she may become aware of in carrying out his / her activity at and / or on behalf of the University. At the same time, each PhD student is required to sign a specific declaration of transfer of intellectual property rights to the University, so that he / she is aware of the application of the relevant legislation and the University Regulations on intellectual property and possibly a confidentiality agreement with the funding body, if required, if the position is funded by an entity external to the University.

Art. 10 - REGULATIONS

1.
